

Constitution and By-Laws

Forensic Science Club

Article I

The Forensic Science Club is designed to enable students in degree programs related to the forensic science field to learn about the career field, establish a presence in the American Association of Forensic Sciences (AAFS), and to form student and professional networks which are dedicated to the improvement of forensic science through the application of science to law.

Article II

All students of the University of North Texas are eligible for membership. Membership dues are \$30 for 1 year or \$15 per semester.

Article III

There will be at least five meetings held per semester.

Article IV

The executive officers for 2008-2009 are:

President-Nicole Wallace
Vice President-Lauren Nimelstein
Secretary-Pedro Davila
Treasurer-Anita Sanchez
Public Relations-Josh Wueller

The duties of these officers are:

President: organizes and arranges club meetings and events, heads meetings, consults with forensic science community

Vice President: assists with presidential duties, heads meetings and events, consults with forensic science community

Secretary: keeps track of members and new members, controls email listserv for club (direct information link for upcoming events for the club and other relevant information)

Treasurer: keeps track of money for club, controls and comes up with fundraisers, collects member fees

Public Relations: publicizes club and upcoming events for the club

* Jr. Officers will assist officers in their particular office

Article V

The officers shall be nominated and elected each April. The newly elected officers will begin the term in August. Any vacancies in an office position shall be filled by the runner-up in the election. In order to be eligible for voting in an election, you must attend at least three meetings each semester.

Article VI

The constitution shall be amended by a $\frac{3}{4}$ majority vote.
